Introduction/Background: Writing scientific biomedical papers proves not so easy, and often such papers do not fulfill the expectations of editors and reviewers and are being rejected. The average peer reviewed biomedical journal rejects 50-70% of the contributions. A manuscript with a certain biomedical topic cannot just be submitted everywhere. Additionally, a quality scientific paper has a certain structure, and the Authors' instructions of a journal must also be taken into account.

Aim: To help the participants to prepare a quality scientific biomedical paper, which increases their chance of their manuscript being accepted for publication.
